- Your intellectual energy and willingness to learn something new every day.

- Ability to read, write, follow written and verbal instructions, and document your process.
- Ability to walk, bend, reach, squat, lift and carry up to 20 lbs., and push a cart up to 60 lbs.

Your time commitment.

- Weekly two-hour commitment for a minimum of 3 months. We'll work out a regularly scheduled day and time that works best for both parties.
- Opportunities are available: Monday-Friday at 8am or 2pm; Saturday at 8:30am or 2pm; Sunday at 12:30pm.
- Attend an initial Library orientation 2.5 hours.
- Attend a training session specific to your duties 2.5 hours.
- Receive on-going training and support as requested/needed.
- No required end date stay as long as you like!
